

Our Vision for Refreshment

We believe in the God of the impossible and recognise our heart is for a vision to see 7000 people encouraged and equipped for mission. We believe that our role for the next five years is in the preparation of missionaries to see the church in the UK revived and refreshed by 2030.

As a charity, Refreshment UK encourages and equips Christians in the UK being obvious in the gospel, blessing the local church and engaging with the culture. They do this by providing mission hubs and experiences, mainly out of 7 locations across the UK.

The vision for the next five years includes the following:

MISSION TRAINING – we have our mission training centre in Blackpool which will host retreats, training courses for churches and a year-long discipleship programme called Breaking the Chains.

MISSION HUBS – we plant buildings that will form a base for changing the atmosphere in 7 towns across the UK. These buildings are provided rent-free for local teams to plan mission that brings help and hope.

MISSION OUTPUT – we enhance our mission hubs by planning a programme to encourage and equip Christians to be obvious about the gospel, bless the local church and engage with the culture.

MISSION COMMUNITY – we connect an army of ordinary people with a heart and vision to bring mission to the UK. The community will receive training, coaching and resources, and an annual national conference.

MISSION EXPERIENCES – we will provide space for people both overseas and in the UK to experience short-term mission trips giving people the opportunity to serve and develop their vision to serve God.

The five core values that Refreshment care about in the UK are:

Making Prayer Our Priority
The Unity of the Broad Church

The Renewing of the Mind To Simply Love Jesus

To Be Spirit-Filled

Refreshment UK are a Christian charity who primarily subscribe to the Evangelical Alliance's statement of faith.



Refreshment UK have been involved in short-term missions for nearly three decades, providing mission trips across the world, but since 2016, we have been focused on the UK and bringing mission from the church to the culture.

Our base has been Blackpool for the last decade, where we have used our residential training centre to find the mission field on the doorstep. We have partnered with 47 churches to deliver events and activities that are obvious in the gospel, bless the local church and engage with the culture.

In Blackpool, we host activities in some of the town's most famous locations, including The Blackpool Tower, Stanley Park and The Winter Gardens. We have hosted over a thousand missionaries in the UK from local churches, YWAM, The Boys Brigade and many more, who have found like us that nothing is impossible with God.

Let's Talk Mission is a great day to explore three key areas of the Refreshment UK vision and ministry – gospel, church and culture - as well as discuss with partners the potential for what could be done within a mission hub. A day will last from 10am to 3pm with drinks breaks, lunch, and include networking as well. This day will encourage you to truly see impossible things happening in your area.

WHAT IS THE REFRESH CENTRE?

The Refresh Centre is a 14-bedroom former care home based in South Shore, Blackpool that has been hosting missionaries from across the world since 2016. Greg and Catherine Doughty are stewarding the property on a lease.

From the Refresh Centre, an environment has been created that welcomes both people on retreat and those on mission training to be in a place where they can meet God. The centre has single rooms across three floors.

The site is reserved for a mission training centre and it is perfect to welcome in a new programme that works alongside local organisations to provide Christian training for ex-offenders. Entitled 'Breaking the Chains', the centre provides a year-long programme for 5 people, who will live on site, alongside a manager, and learn the life of a missionary.

The space enables the extra rooms to continue to welcome visitors who will be able to both retreat and be trained in the centre. Part of the mission training will include regular involvement in street outreach and prayer meetings, including Prayer at the Tower once a month.

WHAT IS REFRESH BLACKPOOL?

Our main mission will happen from Refresh Blackpool, a mission hub in the centre of Blackpool, and this space will provide the following:

The Christian Resource Centre is a hub that provides resources for people to enhance their own Christian faith, with items that can be retailed, read or borrowed

The Chat Cafe which provides a space for drinks on the ground floor, which also acts as a base for the 'Breaking the Chains' team to learn hospitality skills, and for local churches to run regular activities from there.

Refresh Blackpool is managed by Peter Cunningham and Julie Gilbert, and supported by a united team of Christians from across the town.

Hub Life

Ventnor – the activities here will centre around providing autism support **Worcester** – the activities will be focused on a city centre response to social issues **Hinckley** – the focus will be dealing with anxiety, mental health support and identity **South Shields** – the focus will be on deprivation and mental health issues **Milton Keynes** – the focus will be on proclamation and dealing with spiritual warfare **Llandudno** – the focus will be on holiday makers and seafront evangelism

WHAT DOES A MISSION HUB LOOK LIKE?

The aim of a mission hub is to draw people together from across churches with a focus on being obvious in the gospel, blessing the local church and engaging with the culture.

The hub is led by a director and managed by a paid operations manager. Together, they build a team around them of Christians who will serve in various elements of the hub. These are called Refreshers and form part of a national network of pioneer missionaries, who support our vision, but independently serve – they are our army of ordinary people,

In a mission hub, there is the following:

- United worship once a month, in a secular location;
- National Prayer on Zoom at 7.30am (led by a different director);
- Weekly prayer meetings;
- An annual day conference for the local church to share ideas and vision (Let's Talk Mission);
- A day of fasting once a week;
- A week of focused mission once a year;
- A 7-day a week programme of activities that bless and enhance the work of the local church.

KEY ACTIVITIES INCLUDE:

- Running with Jesus sessions to support mental health and fitness
- Street Evangelism
- Regular Prayer Walks
- Offering Prayer Ministry working towards freedom
- Mental Health Support
- Chat Cafes and Resource Centres

the 400 club

At Refreshment UK, we are passionate about bringing mission to the heart of a community and providing a hub where churches can work together to provide help and hope seven days a week. Our amazing vision for the 400 Club is to buy 7 buildings and a training centre across the UK to form the basis to allow Mission 2029 to happen.

By 2030, and completing our appeal, we can buy all of the buildings required and have 7 active mission hubs dealing with the fruit of Refresh 2029.

The 400 Club is focused on three stages:

GET GOING LIKE GIDEON - we will be looking for 300 partners at £400 each **BUILDING UP LIKE BARNABAS** – Adding to the number of regular givers daily **ENDING UP LIKE ELIJAH** – Finally recruiting 7000 fully paid-up members

With 7000 members raising £400 each, we expect to have a budget of £3million to achieve all of the vision of Refreshment UK. Members can fundraise in whatever they feel is appropriate

When we complete the Get Going like Gideon phase of this, we will be in a position to have a full-time member of staff who will be able to keep our supporters interested and build on the number of members of the club. Ideally, they will be based at the Head Office.

Resourcing

From our mission hubs, we will provide Christian resources from across the UK and produce our own resources to equip the Refreshers Community. This will include Bible studies, clothing and evangelistic resources to encourage and equip people, as well as a radio station.

Running with Jesus forms a big part of our resourcing and we will increase the campaigns to promote this across the UK to use it as an opportunity to share the gospel at big running events.

From our head office, we would look to recruit a resourcing director in 2026 as a full-time member of staff who will create, publicise and co-ordinate resources across the UK.

Mission Experiences UK and Overseas

Our intention will be to organise mission experiences both in the UK and overseas. We would organise these in partnership with the local hubs and look to develop our mission trips overseas.

Our UK Summer Missions in will normally take place in August.

We will intend to host missions in the following locations overseas:

Bulgaria April (from 2027)

India January/February 2026 (onwards)

Israel March 2026 (bi-annually)
Italy September 2027 (onwards)
Malta October 2026 (onwards)
Turkey (Ephesus) May 2027 (onwards)

These trips will help people prepare for being part of the mission teams at refresh 2029.

Events & Training

NATIONAL REFRESHERS CONFERENCE & MAGNIFY

Following the success of the 2025 conference, we would look to repeat our conference in 2026 and plan a weekend of mission and speakers at a venue again. We would aim to hold it in March 2026. Magnify should be repeated annually in December in each hub.

THE REFRESH CENTRE

The Refresh Centre is fully available for retreats, mission teams and conferences. All are welcome and the cost will be £30 per person per night for full board accommodation.


